The Kempsey & Alfrick team consists of PC Stanley, PC Smith, PCSO Smith and PCSO Emeny.

For priorities the parish council have provided speeding, Cybercrime and anti-social behaviour these are the three main concerns that have been provided.

We have PC Farmer who is the designated road safety for Malvern who has been provided locations for speed camera operations such as the A44 Bromyard Road. We are regularly patrolling the area of Broadwas and Cotheridge either on foot or in vehicles to make sure everything is in order and organise events such as drop-in session whereby members who live in Broadwas and Cotheridge may attend to ask the team questions or address concerns.

Regarding the horses on the A44 Bromyard Road the owners have been issued a CPNW with conditions to keep the horses in a safe area away from the road. We have seen a decline in reports regarding horses on the A44 however, we urge to continuing to report any incidents to the police either on 101/online or if in an emergency 999, this is very important due to when reports are made this keeps us up to date with concerns in the area and helps us with our patrols as we will focus on areas that have been reported.

We did see an increase of burglaries across Malvern (dwelling/non-dwelling) however, reassurances have been provided and 4 offenders have been arrested in relation to these burglaries. After reports were made regarding these burglaries the team arranged an increase in patrols in the Broadwas and Cotheridge area daytime and nighttime which saw a decline in reports made to the police.
